We write in support of the City of Bangor's Community Connector Public Transit System's application to the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Program. If funded, the City of Bangor seeks to implement fixed route bus stops, build bus shelters, and eliminate flag stops.

The Community Connector Public Transit System has been serving the greater Bangor region including the communities of Brewer, Hampden, Orono, Veazie, and Old Town, Maine, for more than 40 years. This system provides direct service to students and faculty at the University of Maine, the State's largest higher education institution, and Husson University, Eastern Maine Community College, University of Maine Bangor, and Beal College. Since conception, the Community Connector has maintained effective and reliable transportation services for its citizens, many of whom rely on its fixed route bus services to travel to and from work, school, healthcare appointments, shopping, and social activities.


