objectives: developing trenchless slip-lining technology to extend culvert lifespan using 3D-printed wood fiber diffusers and designing low-cost glued-laminated timber bridge decking with advanced wear treatments for durability and ease of replacement. These efforts aim to mitigate rising infrastructure costs due to evolving weather patterns, enhance resilience, and empower local landowners with practical, sustainable solutions.
