- The fiscal year (FY) 2025 federal appropriations process includes opportunities to fund local projects through Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS). This opportunity is only available to nonprofit entities and state and local governments. For-profit entities are **not** eligible for CDS funding.
- The *Build America, Buy America Act* requires that any infrastructure projects funded (in whole or in part) with federal assistance use only iron, steel, manufactured products, and construction materials produced in the United States. This requirement only applies to articles, materials, and supplies that are consumed in, incorporated into, or affixed to an infrastructure project. You certify that (1) you have taken this requirement into account when determining the amount of funding that you are seeking as part of this request, and (2) you understand that, if your organization is awarded CDS funding for infrastructure projects, you must adhere to *Build America, Buy America Act* requirements in order to accept funds.
- The *National Environmental Policy Act* (NEPA) requires every federal agency to follow a specific planning process to ensure that agency decision-makers and applicants have considered and the general public is fully informed about, with the opportunity to comment on, the environmental consequences of a federally funded action. This review and consultation process is used to evaluate the impact a project and its alternatives may have on the environment. The review process is required for federally financed projects – including CDS awards – to ensure that the proposed project does not have a negative impact on the surrounding environment and that the property site itself will not have an adverse environmental or health effect on end users. Not every project is subject to a full environmental review (i.e., every project’s environmental impact must be examined, but the extent of this examination varies), but every project must be in compliance with NEPA and other related federal and state environmental laws. For instance, construction or renovation activities are likely to require a higher level of NEPA review than equipment purchases or training activities. You certify that (1) you have taken this requirement into consideration when preparing your application, and (2) you understand that, if your organization is awarded CDS funding, you must adhere to the awarding agency’s NEPA processes and requirements.
- The *National Historic Preservation Act* (NHPA) requires federal agencies to take into account the effects of their undertakings on historic properties. Federal agencies must consult with parties who have an interest in the effects of the undertaking in order to identify the affected historic properties, assess the effect of the undertaking on historic properties, and seek ways to avoid, minimize, or treat any adverse effects on historic properties. You certify that (1) you have taken this requirement into account, and (2) you understand that, if your organization is awarded CDS funding for a project that affects historic properties, you must adhere to the awarding agency’s NHPA processes and requirements.
- Certain federal programs require matching funds or an applicant contribution in order to accept CDS funds, if awarded. You certify that (1) you have taken this requirement into account, and (2) you understand that, if your organization is awarded CDS funding through a federal program that requires matching funds, you will have the necessary matching funds on-hand by the time the funds are awarded in order to draw down the CDS funding.
